



LESSONS LEARNED

Reflecting on the Moral of the Story

OBJECTIVE

The learner will consider the moral of a story; recount and write their own example of a valuable lesson.

TIME

45 minutes.

MATERIALS

Copy of an ABRA story, paper and writing materials.

WARM UP: READ A STORY IN ABRA

- 1. Sign in to ABRACADABRA.
- 2. Choose the category Understanding the Story.
- 3. Choose Comprehension Monitoring from the activity list.
- 4. Select *The Frogs and the Well* from the available list.
- 5. Click on Go.
- 6. Click on Play.
- 7. Circulate while learners are reading and ask them to answer the questions aloud.

CLASSROOM DISCUSSION: MORALS

Like many fables, *The Frogs* and the Well ends with a moral lesson. This tells us how we can be better people. Use it as a springboard to talk about consequences to one's actions. Prompt learners with:

- What was the point of the story?
- What kind of animals did the author use?
- Which characters had good traits? What were they?
- Which characters had bad traits? What were they?
- Did any characters ignore good advice? Why? What happened to them?
- Can you think of other stories or songs that tried to teach you a lesson?

WRITING THEIR OWN LESSONS

- Call on some learners to share instances of something they did done that was not very wise.
- 2. Split the class into groups of 4 and have them share their experiences and the repercussions.
- Let them discuss this for 10 minutes.
- 4. Guide them to pick one story from the group.
- 5. Each team member will write a couple of sentences to explain the event and draw a picture.
- 6. Bind all pages together to create a full story.
