








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Introduction

Introduction

Fluency is the bridge between Alphabetics and Comprehension. Fluent readers are able to identify and group words quickly to understand the meaning of the texts they read. Fluent readers are able to read texts aloud as if they were speaking.

Fluency includes:

- Accuracy is the ability to read a text with little or no errors.
- Speed (fluency) refers to how fast a child can read.
- Expression is when a reader changes their voice to help convey feelings and meaning.

Fluency: About this Skill

What is Reading Fluency?

Fluency is the ability to quickly recognize words and their meaning. This applies not only to words in isolation, but also when encountering connected words in a sentence. A fluent reader's oral reading sounds as natural as speaking.

This skill takes time to develop. To help support your learners, provide them with:

- Opportunities for oral reading;
- · Repetition of the same text; and
- Modeling and feedback.

A child's fluency skills will fluctuate depending on the text and their familiarity with the words.

What is Fluency? (Video Script)

In the <u>online version of this module</u>, there is a video that describes core fluency skills. The transcript is provided in the PDF version of the module.

In this video, you'll learn about Fluency, which is the ability to read with accuracy, speed and expression. Fluency is key to understanding a text. Fluent readers are able to quickly and easily decode words so they can then focus on the meaning of those words.

So what skills do fluent readers have?

Fluent readers are accurate, they recognize and pronounce words correctly. They also read at an appropriate speed, not too fast or too slow. Finally, they read with expression. They know when to pause and how to read in a way that conveys the right mood and makes text easier to understand.

Let's listen to a fluent reader:

"Once upon a time, Little Red Hen lived on a farm with a dog, a pig, and a cow. Little Red Hen worked hard every day to go plant in her garden."

Now, a non-fluent reader might sound like this:
"I -little Red Henl Worked Hard Every day To grow plants i

"L-little... Red... Hen! Worked. Hard. Every day. To grow plants in her garden."

As you just heard, fluent reading makes all the difference in being able to understand a text.

So how do children achieve fluency?







Research shows that they need specific kinds of practice. First, children should read out loud. It is not enough for them to silently read words on the page. Although, researchers aren't sure why silent reading does not provide the same benefits as reading out loud. Secondly, children need to hear and then read the same text several times. This repetition helps build fluency. Finally, children need guidance and feedback as they read. In other words, they need a listener who will provide help and suggestions. You might think that the teacher should be the listener, however, research shows that other children can successfully provide guidance and useful feedback, just like an adult.

By reading together, in small groups, children can develop and practice the core skills of accuracy, speed and expression.

Children can also use the activities in the ABRACADABRA Reading section, to work on their Fluency skills. For further practice, they can turn to READS, which provides access to hundreds of electronic books.

The ABRACADABRA training and support materials will provide more guidance in how best to use ABRACADABRA and READS to develop essential fluency skills.

What are High Frequency Words?


High frequency words are also referred to as sight words. These are the most common words used in written texts. Some examples of sight words are "the", "was" and "said". The difficulty with high frequency words is that many do not follow standard decoding patterns, nor can they be represented by pictures. By memorizing these words, children are able to quickly and easily move on to the next word in the sentence. This helps build their confidence in their reading ability.





What is Accuracy?

Accuracy is a foundation for fluency. Accuracy is the ability to read the words with few deviations or mistakes. These readers are able to automatically recognize many words, and decode the unfamiliar ones.



To help children build this skill, they can record themselves reading a passage. As they listen to the playback, they can evaluate it and compare to a recording of a fluent reader (such as their teacher).

What is Speed?

Reading speed, or reading rate, is the number of words per minute (WPM) someone can correctly read. To determine whether a child is reading at an appropriate rate, the reader is compared to the average WPM for their age or grade.


Typically, adults read between 200-250 words per minute. Comparatively, your learners on average should be able to read 30-90 words per minute aloud by the end of the first grade. This develops over the year, for example, children typically read 0-10 words in the first semester. This grows to 10-50 in the second semester. And by the end of the year, they read 30-90.

WPM can vary if the person is reading in their second language.

If one of your learners is not meeting this basic criterion, they need extra practice. However, speed at the cost of accuracy is not recommended.

What is Expression?

Fluency also encompasses the ability to read with expression, sometimes referred to as prosody. This goes beyond being able to quickly read words. Children must learn how to divide the text with meaningful pauses, where to emphasize words, and select an appropriate tone for the meaning of the text they are reading. Using accurate tone, stress, timing and pitch helps convey the meaning of the text.









Early Disfluent Readings

In the <u>online version of this module</u>, there are three video clip samples of a young reader. An explanation of the difficulties she encounters is described in this PDF document, but you must go to the online version (or download the html version) of the module to listen to her reading.

She is just learning to read, so she struggles with fluency. These clips demonstrate common difficulties with accuracy and speed. As she is at the beginning stage of learning, she does not yet read with expression.

No Pat, No. Don't sit on that.

She is reading slowly although she is mostly accurate. There are a few sight words that she already knows that makes reading more fluent. However, when she gets to the word "Pat" she has to sound it out. Similarly, "sit" needs to be decoded letter by letter, but she erroneously says "sat". She makes an error with the word "on" by saying "in". She is unable to read the word "that" without help. This reading pattern would likely interfere with her comprehension of the text.

Off

She originally thinks the word is "on", but manages to self-correct. She stressed the word as she decodes it.

Pat sat on cat.

She is able to read this accurately, but does so slowly. Comprehension should be better at this rate.

Pause and Think

Activity: Group Discussion or Individual Reflection

Scenario: John takes his time to sound out words until he says them correctly. As he is focused on decoding the words, he reads each word slowly and with the same inflection in his voice. He does not pause for punctuation. Often, John has trouble connecting the words together in order to understanding the full text.

Find High Frequency Words

High frequency words are the most commonly used words written in text. They contribute a lot of the meaning of the text, but children tend to find them hard because they are phonetically difficult or have complex definitions. Ask children to practice these words so they can read them guickly and easily when they encounter them.

High Frequency Words Lists: Dolch (see *Appendix B*) has created a list by grade, while Fry's list (see *Appendix C*) contains the top 1000 words. Take a look at both of those documents, then try to identify which words are high frequency words in this activity.

Change the Meaning by Emphasizing Words

A sentence such as "I never said Paul ate your lunch.", can be read in a straightforward way. It's clear and gets its meaning across. However, you can use expression to meaningfully pause on a word. By emphasizing a certain word, the meaning of the sentence can drastically change.

I never said Paul ate your lunch.

- I: By stressing the word "I", it implies that someone other than me said it. It sounds more accusatory.
- **Never**: stressing the word "never" adds an element of protest to this sentence. I didn't say this.
- **Said**: if "said" is emphasized, it implies that I communicated that Paul did eat your lunch in a manner other than speech, such as by writing it down, or I mentioned it indirectly.
- Paul: stressing "Paul" implies that I accused someone other than Paul.
- Ate: when stressing this word, it implies that I said Paul did something to your lunch, but he didn't eat it.
- Your: if "your" is stressed, it implies that I accused Paul of eating someone's lunch, just not yours.
- **Lunch**: when the word "lunch" is emphasized, it implies that I told you Paul ate something of yours, it just wasn't your lunch.

 - By emphasizing "I", it implies that I'm the only one that loves my cat.

 - By stressing the word "love", it puts the emphasis on the depth of the emotion.

 - Correct! By emphasizing the word "the", it implies that there is only one gold medal that could be won. It can also be used to emphasize the prestige of this award.







d) Gold medal

Emphasizing this points to its status. It is the highest award that can be given. Anyone that knows about sports would also know only one gold medal is given per category. However, emphasizing "gold medal" doesn't in itself imply that there is only one gold medal in the whole competition.

- e) For
 - Emphasizing this word highlights the object or purpose, not what is to be won.
- f) Long-distance Emphasizing this word highlights what category her award is in. The medal is not for the short- or middle-distance competition.
- g) Running Emphasizing this word highlights what category her award is in. The medal is not for long-distance cycling, for example.

Using ABRA to Support Fluency

Reading

There are six activities in ABRA that support your learners as they develop their fluency skills. Four of these activities help children develop the core characteristics of fluency. The other activities are ways to support the development of these skills. This section of ABRA also contains a number of stories that were written by young children.

Characteristics of Fluent Reading

Fluent readers are able to read texts quickly and understand the meaning of these texts. These children can accurately read a text aloud, using expression and a proper speed. Building strong fluency skills is essential to a child's academic success. The children with poor fluency skills risk falling behind in all subjects, not just their literacy skills.

Let's Go!: Tips and Techniques

Suggestions for Incorporating Fluency in your Classroom

<u>Tips</u>

- When practicing reading, have children read to another learner. Repeated readings to another individual or small groups help children develop their fluency skills; 3-4 oral re-readings are recommended.
- Ensure that every learner has the chance to read aloud to someone else.
- When the class is reading in pairs, angle the chairs so that one child is reading to another.

Teacher Aids

The CSLP has prepared a number of resources for teachers. These include technical support for the ABRA tool, pedagogical support for helping children build their literacy skills, and classroom activity and resource suggestions.

Reading Strategies for the Classroom

There are different reading practice methods you can try in your classroom. The following strategies rely on repetition and feedback for maximum effectiveness.

Collaboration & Reflection

Suggested strategies on how teachers can learn from their own experiences, receive input from colleagues, and provide feedback to support their peers.

Tips

Here are some ideas to help you get started.

- Provide learners with opportunities where they'll succeed by selecting texts that are in their independent reading level (95% accuracy rate).
- **5 Finger Rule**: if one the first page, the child makes 5 errors, the text is too hard to practice fluency or independent fun reading.
- When children get more skilled, it is important to vary the complexity of the text to stretch them and improve their expression skills and vocabulary.
- Pause-Prompt-Praise: when the learner is stuck on a word, wait a moment to see if the learner can self-correct. If they are still stuck, prompt them with strategies, such as saying the first sound, saying it slowly, looking at the picture, etc. If they are still stuck, tell them the word. Praise the child for their effort and success afterwards. Be sure to highlight which strategies worked well so they continue to use them when they are stuck on a word.
- Vary the type of reading material your learners practice with. For example, consider bringing in a children's magazine for reading practice.







- Have learners record their own reading practice. After some time, these recordings can be compared to illustrate how the child has improved their fluency skills.
- Create a reading buddy system in your school. Older learners can be paired with younger learners. The older learners model fluent reading to the younger ones.
 Then younger learners should then read a text at their level to the older learners.

Teacher Aids

This classroom activity asks learners to act as a character in a story. They are encouraged to use expression while they are the character.

This document contains some sample sight words found in the ABRA stories.

<u>High Frequency Practice</u> (see *Appendix F*)

This document contains more challenging words found in the ABRA stories. These cards can be used to help improve learners' accuracy and speed.

Reading Strategies for the Classroom

Two common classroom strategies used in reading practice is round-robin and choral reading. In round-robin, each learner takes a turn to read a small passage aloud in front of the whole class. In choral reading, the teacher and learners read the text in unison. Research has shown that these strategies are not very effective as each learner only reads a small amount of text on their own.

Here are some alternative strategies to help increase children's fluency skills.

Student-Adult or Student-Reading Buddy.







- Partner Reading.
- Audio Assisted.
- Echo Reading.
- Reader's Theatre.

Student-Adult or Student-Reading Buddy

An adult, or a fluent older learner, and child read one-on-one. The adult or older learner provides a model of fluent reading. The child rereads the same text until they can read the passage fluently.

It is recommended that this type of activity is used four times a week. Each session should last about 10 minutes.



Two learners read the text together, taking turns reading passages aloud. It is important that the children have a partner that can provide help. The paired learners should be reading from the same book to facilitate feedback. Before starting this activity, remind learners what good reading and feedback should sound like. Vary the paired partners to provide different models and feedback.

Consider using a *Reading Record* (see *Appendix H*) to log which books were read by which learners.

Audio Assisted

The child reads the text while listening to an audio recording of a fluent reader. The texts selected should be at the child's independent reading level. On the first pass, the child can follow along silently with the audio by pointing to each word. On the second pass, the child should attempt to read aloud with the audio. They continue to do so until they can fluently read the text independently.









Echo Reading

Sit with learners, preferably facing one another in a circle. The teacher reads a passage and then the learners repeat what the teacher just read. The teacher must ensure that the text is visible to the whole group by using a big book, projector, or providing each learner with their own copy. The book selected should be fairly short and at the independent reading level of most learners in the group. If projected, make sure someone points to the words as they are read.

During echo reading activities, the teacher models important skills such as:

- Correct tone of voice.
- When and where in the text to read slowly or faster.
- Using the appropriate expression for the context of the story.
- Showing different emotions through one's voice.

Reader's Theatre

The learners rehearse and perform a play in front of the rest of the class. These plays can be based on books they are familiar with that have extensive dialogue they can use. This strategy can help build their speed and accuracy skills as learners reread the texts multiple times. The performance aspect helps build learner's skills with expression.

Note: the learners will have varied fluency practice with this strategy as each character will have a different number of lines. Nevertheless, many learners enjoy this type of activity, so it's useful for increasing motivation and fostering cooperation.

Collaboration and Reflection

Here are some ideas to help you get started.

Lesson Plans

Work with a colleague that teaches the same grade as you. Together create lesson plans (see *Appendix I*), brainstorm activity ideas, and share worksheets. Once you have implemented the lesson, regroup to share your experiences. Discuss both successes and difficulties. Share strategies on how to overcome those difficulties.





- 1. Divide learners into groups of four.
- Assign each group a story or allow them to choose one.
- 3. Guide each learner to pick a role (character).
- Watch as learners
 practice the character's
 lines and actions.
 If the narrator mostly tells
 the story, have learners
 rewrite the story to give
 the characters more lines.
- Remind learners to pay attention to expression and gestures.
- 6. Allow learners to select a costume for their character.

OPENING NIGHT

- Call up each group to present their skit.
 You can expand the event:
 - Invite the kindergarten learners to be the audience
 - Work with other grade 1 teachers to have many skits
 - Do the presentations in the evening and invite parents
 - Videotape the skits as part of learners' portfolios.
- Have a group discussion after all groups have presented.
 - How does the expression in someone's voice help us understand what happened?
 - How do gestures help us understand what happened?
 - Did any groups make changes to the story?

HELPING STUDENTS BUILD THEIR READING SKILLS

READING (Fluency)

The goals of literacy are to be able to construct meaning effectively from a written text and to encode written text accurately in writing. In order to do this, students need to master a number of skills. Activities in ABRACADABRA are inter-related, therefore, if you notice your student is struggling in one area, you may want to suggest doing another activity that focuses on the same broad skill. You could also use this list to determine where students can extend the practice of recently acquired skills. This allows them to practice and develop their mastery of these skills.

Fluency is the ability to read texts quickly and accurately, using proper speed and expression. Because fluent readers are able to decode words quickly, they can focus on the meaning of a text.



Glossary



Fluency Module Glossary

ABRACADABRA (ABRA): a tool in the LTK+ suite that is designed to support children's acquisition of early literacy.

Accuracy: the ability to read a text with little or no errors.

Alphabetics: the ability to recognize the different sounds in a spoken language and then match those sounds to written letters and words. Alphabetic skills include: letter knowledge, phonological and phonemic awareness, and phonics.

Comprehension: the ability to understand information within a text.

ePEARL: a web-based portfolio software, offered within the LTK+ suite. It is designed to support children's acquisition of self-regulated learning (SRL) skills.

Expression: when a reader changes their voice (meaningful pauses, emphasizing words, and appropriate tone and pitch) to help convey feelings and meaning.

Feedback: information provided to help someone identify what is working well and what needs improvement.

Fluency: the ability to quickly recognize words and their meaning. Fluent readers are able to read with accuracy, speed, and expression.

High Frequency Words (sight words): These are the most common words used in written texts.

Modeling: a teaching strategy where the teacher demonstrates to learners how to accomplish a task. The learners observe the teachers' behaviour and then imitate the teachers' actions.

Oral Reading: reading text aloud.

READS: a multilingual catalogue of digital books offered as part of the LTK+ suite of tools.

Speed: refers to how fast a child can read. Reading speed is calculated by the number of words per minute (WPM) someone can correctly read.
